Dear Friends

On this third Sunday of Lent the theme of repentance rings out from the gospel. That is the call from Jesus to societies and their individuals to turn from ways that lead to the diminution and destruction of life toward the life-giving ways of God.

In recent weeks we have seen horror unfold in Ukraine. We have also seen the virtues of Philippians 4:8 - that which is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent or praiseworthy.

Despite the feeling of helplessness in the face of such deepening turmoil most of us, if not all, will have been constant in our prayers for peace. We will have given money, visited collection points with useful items or clothing. At the time of writing this letter (9th March) the DEC appeal stands at well over £100 million. We have seen people nearer to borders who, moved by the plight of strangers, have opened their homes as places of sanctuary. We have been humbled by the politicians, medics, priests, carers, firefighters, and many others who have chosen to stay in the place of danger with those whom they serve rather than look first to their own safety. In the midst of the deepening turmoil we have seen the virtues of Philippians 4:8 displayed by ordinary people.

This Lent the life-giving ways of God to which we are called shine in stark contrast to the ways that diminish or destroy life.
